In this country we have our own problems with food-banks still much needed for many and growing unrest about inflation and wages not matching the rising cost of living.

With all this going on around us our problems are in some way put into a different perspective. Led by Revd Mandy our church and services continue much as before. It was very special to hold a Christmas morning service, which was well attended, and the school put on a lovely event in the church for us all to enjoy. At these times the church continues to be a reassuring reminder of family times past and the journey of life.

The PCC continues to plan ahead and face the challenge of maintaining our beautiful church in these difficult times. For the last few years our income has taken a big hit due to the cancellation of fund-raising activities through the pandemic. Our small reserves have been used for the essential payment of utilities and insurance, which as for everyone else has seen a rise in cost. However, we are incredibly appreciative of the support given to our raffles and other initiatives which have been essential in meeting these day-to-day essential expenses. A number of people also give an amount each month as a direct debit and this was particularly appreciated when the church was closed throughout the pandemic. If you would like to give a regular donation this way there is information at the church or please speak to one of the churchwardens. The church also does rely on many people giving their time freely to maintain fabric and ensure the building is always available for services and special occasions and we are very grateful for that.



This year, with the Kings' Coronation, and his focus on using that as an opportunity to help local causes, we are hoping that the church can feature as one such initiative. Please keep a lookout for further information through the usual communication channels.

#### Burton Water to Brayford Pool & Back


Distance – approx. 6 miles (10 kms) (2.5 – 3 hours) OS Explorer Map 272 An easy and level walk along paths and side roads. 0



1. Starting from the car park of the Woodcocks Pub & Motel, with the pub behind you turn right away from the A57 and head towards the canal between the motel and children's play area. Go through a wooden gate and climb the steps onto the canal towpath, turn left and walk along the canal bank. After a few yards you will find an information board about the Fossdyke canal trail, continue along the path crossing over a footbridge allowing boats passage onto the canal from the marina. Continue along the path which provides good views of Lincoln cathedral and castle, until you arrive a the A46 bridge. At this point the path continues under the bridge and in front of the Pyewipe pub. If there has been a lot of rain then it would be better to turn left before the bridge and follow the cycle path route 64 down, and turn right under the bridge taking care on the road and walk through the pub car park instead.

2. Either way the paths joins again and continue alongside the canal ignoring the paths on your left. You will notice a golf course to your left. As the area becomes residential a mix of old and new buildings, the path will finish and continue along a pavement towards Lincoln, when the road turns to the left, cross the road and continue along a footpath and continue under the bridge and you will reach Brayford.

3. From here you can further explore Lincoln, take a rest at one of the many cafes or make your return following the above directions in reverse!





## North Clífton Parísh Meetíng

The final Parish meeting of 2022 took place in the Sports Pavilion on Coalyard Lane on December 1<sup>st</sup>. A healthy turnout of parishioners discussed topics including the following.

**Setting the Parish precept for 2023/24**. The villages finances remain healthy so after going through this year's outgoings and the likely expenditure for next year it was agreed to keep the precept at the same level as this current year.

Seats/benches. The meeting decided to provide seats/benches at the following locations,

Recycled plastic benches at Church bends and the copse at the A1133/Mill Lane junction, a wooden Jubilee seat on the Green and a wooden seat at the junction on Back Lane and Trent Lane. The existing bench on the Green will be taken away over the winter and cleaned and treated ready for going back in the spring. Thanks to Pete Croft and Dave Sanders for arranging this.

**Grass cutting on the Green.** Parishioners had noticed that the green hadn't looked as good in 2022 as previous years. The grass was often longer than people expected to see it. This was due to health issues and transport problems and will hopefully resolve itself before next summer. We were grateful that it had been cut before the Carols on the Green event.

**Broadband.** Maggie Firth has been liaising with Open Reach and trying to get the next phase of fibre broadband brought into the village. At the time of the meeting the outcome was undecided but since then we have learnt that the village now has enough "vouchers" to enable the scheme to go ahead and certainly Openreach employees have been seen in the village doing survey work. No time scales for work starting on the ground yet, but progress is being made. I know Maggie has been beavering away in the background for quite sometime on the village's behalf so well-done Maggie, it will be nice to see our small village finally catching up with its larger neighbours.



**North Clifton What's app group**. The meeting thought that Jen Heppell's suggestion of setting up a WhatsApp group, just for North Clifton Parish, was a good idea and agreed to support the initiative. The WhatsApp group has now been set up to act a little like a Neighbourhood watch. If people see suspicious activity or disturb something going on the first call should always be the Police either through 999 or 101, but a message can also be sent out through the group to alert others in the village about what is happening. The message content should focus on fact, not gossip or chit chat,

so that the information is taken seriously. Anyone with a mobile phone and the WhatsApp, app, can be included. Just send your name, mobile phone number, and address to the parish email, which is **n.c.parish.meeting@gmail.co.uk**.

The evening was concluded with a social event in the pavilion, which appeared to be well received by those that attended.



## South Clifton Parish Council

Bindy Dadswell, on behalf of SCPC, has been attending meetings and keeping up to date with the new plans that J G Pears has submitted to Bassetlaw District Council. This is her report.

#### This Impacts Our Community.....Please read on

JG Pears the food processing giant has submitted plans to build a large packing plant and storage facility for poultry by-products on the former Low Marnham Power Station site. Pears acquired the decommissioned High Marnham Power Station in 2020 which is just up the road from their existing rendering facility on Low Marnham. The new facility will operate 24-7 and includes machines to crush and freeze product.

As the planning application is with Bassetlaw District Council our community is not a group that would normally be consulted on the project.

I feel strongly that it will have a significant impact on our community; increased noise and light pollution and not least the potential for more pongs! There will be floodlight lighting on the outside of buildings and increased noise from machinery and vehicles. I am fairly sure that all in our community have experienced the smell at one time or another, it is likely that the new facility will increase the risk of strong odours.

Back in February I attended a meeting of 'Parishes Together' a group of parishes neighbouring the proposed development. We discussed the site, how it might impact us and how we would like Pears to consider our concerns.

There is no question this development will go ahead, we need to share our concerns with Pears and ask them to consider options to lessen the impact, communication is key. If as a community we stay silent without voicing our concerns as loudly as possible it will be too late!

You can view the detailed plans online, just Google "Bassetlaw planning portal". There are a number of other online resources you can access to understand the plans and what other communities are doing, search J G Pears Low Marnham and will find JG Pears own website which describes the plans as well as independent reports from Lincolnshire Live. There is also information on the Frampton Town Planning website, they are the consultants managing the planning application for Pears. Finally, there is a Facebook group J G Pear Campaign Group.


