SOUTH CLIFTON PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

We hope everyone is enjoying the summer and making the most of the beautiful surroundings in and around our village. Here are the latest updates from South Clifton Parish Council:

TRENT VALE TRAIL

The Trent Vale Trail is now officially open to the public and has already been enjoyed by many walkers and cyclists. Signage is on the way and we're currently exploring the placement of a new bench along the trail to commemorate the 80th anniversary of VE Day. Remember to keep safety in mind when using the trail and pay particular attention when exiting onto Coal Yard Lane if cycling as the road is used frequently by vehicles.

ONE EARTH SOLAR FARM

The proposed solar farm is currently in the examination phase. The first round of hearings took place throughout July, and the examining authority has now published their list of questions for Deadline 2, which is 21st August. South Clifton Parish Council will be submitting a response based on the information presented so far. August will also see an accompanied site inspection and several issue-specific hearings. The next phase, Deadline 3, is scheduled for September, offering an opportunity to review and comment on responses to the Deadline 2 questions. We'll continue to keep villagers informed as the process unfolds.

Remember: if you registered as an interested party, you have the right to make your voice heard and we encourage you to submit responses at the various stages should you wish. If you need any advice or support with this, speak to any of the parish councillors (listed alongside our contact details) who will be happy to help.

SAFER NEIGHBOURHOODS GROUP

New "It's 30 for a reason" signs have been requested for the village, as the current ones are showing signs of wear. These will help reinforce safe driving speeds through South Clifton.

MILL FIELD PROJECT

Newark & Sherwood District Council will be taking on the management and maintenance of Mill Field. The included allotment spaces will be overseen by the South Clifton Mill Field group. We'll share further updates as the project progresses.

PEARS SMELL

The smell emitted by Pears can be particularly strong during the summer months. Please remember to report any occurrences to the Environment Agency by calling 0800 80 70 60 or reporting online at gov.uk/report-smell. It only takes a minute, but every report helps ensure the issue is properly recorded.

COAL YARD LANE ROAD CLOSURE

BT will be carrying out work to connect the pavilion to the internet. As a result, Coal Yard Lane will be closed on Thursday 4th September between 9:30am and 3:30pm. We expect access will still be possible for residents, but we'll confirm this closer to the date.

FLOOD RESILIENCE STORE

Thanks to a further grant, our flood resilience store is now well stocked with sandbags and other supplies. It is being actively managed by our village flood wardens.

VILLAGE WHATSAPP GROUP – CRIME & SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

A controlled WhatsApp group has been set up to quickly report any potential crime or suspicious activity. Many residents have already joined. If you'd like to be added, please contact Adam Faux on 07976 099524.

NORTH CLIFTON PARISH UPDATE

The Parish held is annual parish meeting on June 19th at the village hall where 20 people attended. The village chose to re-elect all officers en-bloc, with no one else offering to step in so for the following year they are, Chair, James Radley, Vice Chair Peter Brumpton, Treasurer Jane Radley, Minute taker, Bex Walker, Planning officer, David White, Strategic flood warden, Dr Andy Hughes, Operational flood wardens, Brumpton and Peter Watson, neighbourhoods group rep, Dr Andy Hughes and village fishing Bailiff Terry Baxter. There are also several other roles that whilst not elected are worthy of mention and for which we should thank. Dave Sanders for planting and the upkeep of the planters on the green, and for treating the village seats with wood preserver. John Ravenscroft for diligently keeping the green in order, Maggie Firth and Sharon Rose for door knocking in relation to flooding and adopting the green, Beccy Chell for maintaining the Defibrillator and a hand full of unnamed volunteers who turn out to litter pick, cut bits of grass verge and report issues and generally make the village a nicer place to be. Thank you and well done to all concerned. (I just hope I haven't forgotten anyone)!

At the business meeting after the AGM the village agreed to install signs on the fishing pegs at the bottom of Trent lane, indicating the pegs were for villagers only. This has now been done and Terry Baxter and Ian Chell have been monitoring activity. I

understand unauthorised fishing is starting to drop off so maybe we are starting to get the message across.

On 5th July the Arts group held, what is now an annual arts festival. It was estimated that over 400 people visited the event and viewed work from about 20 local artists. A fantastic event for such a small village and a fitting tribute to the talent we have living in our community.

In the evening the venue hosted the annual village party, A slightly different format to last year where the emphasis was on family fun games. This year the format revolved around a band performing some rock a billy style music. It was well attended with about 50 people listening and joining in up to closing time. Thanks to the Arts group for covering the cost of the band, the Red Lion for providing an outside bar and June and Peter Croft for allowing the village to use their land. It should be noted that none of the costs associated with the Arts festival or the party came from the Parish Rates, it was all from stall rents, sponsorship and a couple of grants obtained by the Arts group.

AUTUMN WALK

NORTH CLIFTON CIRCULAR

Distance – approx. 4 3/4 miles (7.6km)

(2 hours)

OS Explorer Maps 271

Gentle easy walk on flat tracks

and field paths

As this maybe the penultimate walk for the newsletter, we thought we would travel some well walked paths for those newer than us to the villages.

1. The walk starts at the St George the Martyr Church between North and South Clifton.

Walk through the iron gates and along the church path, pass the church porch and continue along the grass path, under a couple of trees to meet a kissing gate. Go through the gate and follow the path through a couple of horse paddocks and 2 further kissing gate to arrive at the riverbank. Be aware of any electric fences on route. Climb up the bank, turn right and walk along, passing under the viaduct for about 1/2 mile until reaching a lane on your right. Walk along this lane into North Clifton.






2. Continue along this lane through the village, passing the now closed Japanese

garden, on reaching the village green, go passed the bus stop and head for the main road (A1133). Cross this road with care, continue along this lane, following it as it turns right, at the T junction, turn left passing a farm, the lane will become a field path, continue on this as it turns right, there is a small dwelling on your left and you will meet the Sustrans cycle route 64.

3. Turn right walk about 1 1/4 miles along the track passing under a bridge, then the old Clifton railway station on your left, continue under another bridge (A1133), shortly after there is a signpost and take the path on the right, this runs parallel along the cycle track and slowly descends to Church Lane. Pass through the metal gate (usually open) and turn left back to the Church.

Thank you for all your support, our not-for-profit business continues to go from strength to strength.

We're open every Saturday from 10am to 12 noon with our pop-up cafe and refill station. While you sample our homemade cakes, and have a cup of coffee, we will prepare your refill order – the earlier you arrive, the better the choice of cakes!

We have also introduced a free monthly raffle for all you refillers, every time you buy products from us, we will give you a raffle ticket to be entered into that month's draw for a goody bag of our products – the more times you shop, the more tickets you will receive – good luck!

We wanted to give you a quick update on recycling, there are now so many easy ways to do this: By taking your soft plastic to your local supermarket, putting your old clothes in the clothes bank at Coronation Hall, taking old spectacles and sunglasses to the opticians and for insulin pens, ask for a Pencycle box. Collingham Pharmacist has boxes for recycling too, so why not check them out. Boots will take your blister packs — you need to download the Recycle at Boots app before going to your local store, then when you deposit 5 or more packs in one go, the bonus is you receive 500 advantage card points when you spend over £10 within 3 days off doing your recycling. For electrical goods, check out

www.recycleyourelectricals.org.uk.

Don't forget to put your used batteries in a clear bag on top of your green bin when you put it out and we will also continue to take your used stamps in the pavilion too.

We have some new dog pooh bags in stock – they are made from recycled sea plastic waste and oyster shells - £1.60 a roll of 20. They are biodegradable too.

We will have a stall at Collingham Show on Saturday 20th September and also at the Autumn Market in the Coronation Hall on Sunday 12th October, so why not come along and see what we have to offer to help you make one or two simple swaps to reduce your plastic use?


